Coronavirus (Covid-19) brings challenging times to our Fellowship

TRADITION ONE – OUR COMMON WELFARE SHOULD COME FIRST; PERSONAL RECOVERY DEPENDS ON A.A. UNITY.

In March 2020, the Irish Government announced specific restrictions around social distancing measures in a bid to help combat the spread of the Coronavirus COVID-19 in Ireland which led to some confusion amongst some areas of the Fellowship on whether Groups should close their meetings. A decision to close groups, on a temporary basis, was necessitated by the Government's directive. Meetings in Ulster/Northern Ireland, were also temporarily closed following the UK Government's directive.

Government and Health Service Executive advice, in relation to the coronavirus (COVID 19), is being regularly monitored.

The AA website www.alcoholicsanonymous.ie has proved to be an important aid in providing regular updates to the Fellowship, especially during these exceptional times.

Groups, Areas, Intergroup officers, in fact, all levels of the AA Structure that are issued with official AA Mailboxes are encouraged to access their mailboxes too for regular updates.

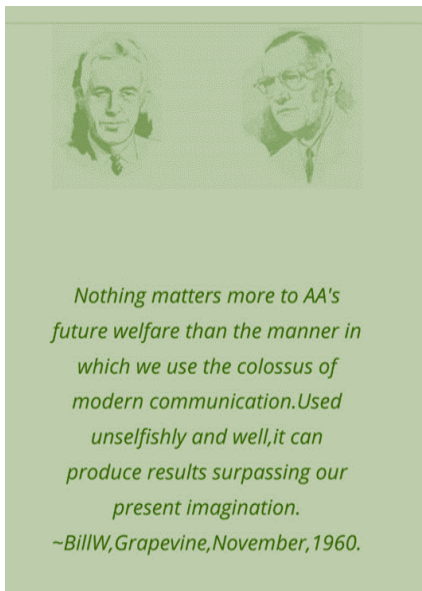
PREAMBLE ©

Postponed and cancelled AA Meetings

A decision was taken on 24th March 2020 to suspend the 'Find a Meeting/Plan your Meeting' section on the website as accuracy of the information displayed could not be guaranteed.

Groups that had to temporarily close their meetings due to Coronavirus (COVID-19) can be assured that their information is NOT removed from our database, it was made inactive and will be activated again in due course.

Online Meetings Social Media Platforms and Social Networking Sites

We are conscious that there are many alternative ways to keep in touch and, indeed, to hold virtual meetings e.g., WhatsApp Zoom, Skype, etc.

The General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous Ireland, without instruction from Alcoholics Anonymous General Service Conference of Ireland, cannot endorse these online meetings. However, given the ever-increasing requests from AA groups during these challenging times, it has been decided to introduce AA Meetings online. This is an acknowledgement and does not constitute an endorsement. Only Conference can ratify and endorse these changes. This will be brought to Conference at the first opportunity, when the current COVID-19 emergency has ended. There are strict guidelines in place for groups wishing to avail of this service and these will be fully enforced at all times. These steps are necessary to protect the anonymity and confidentiality of members wishing to attend.

The personal anonymity or confidentiality of those attending online meetings or using other media platforms may not be protected.

AA telephone services could consider extending their hours as a way of reaching out .

The website was updated with 'Suggested Guidelines for Groups to hold Online Meetings' and included necessary steps to protect the anonymity and confidentiality of members wishing to attend, and to preserve the precious unity of the fellowship which we all work so hard to maintain.

This acknowledgement is our effort to accept all who seek the hand of AA, and to unite us in our common purpose, and not divide us in our differences.

A Temporary Registration Form for AA Ireland Meetings Online was introduced to facilitate groups that want to include their online meetings on the website. Certain checks and balances were included to ensure that only groups registered with GSO and approved within the Structure of AA could be included.

General Service Office (GSO)

GSO continues to provide a range of services to members and the public. Staff are now working from home and are connected remotely to the workstations in the office.

There has been little interruption to service. Literature orders can still be placed with GSO and we will endeavour to fulfil those orders as soon as possible when the Governments directives are updated accordingly.

just as they were healed themselves.

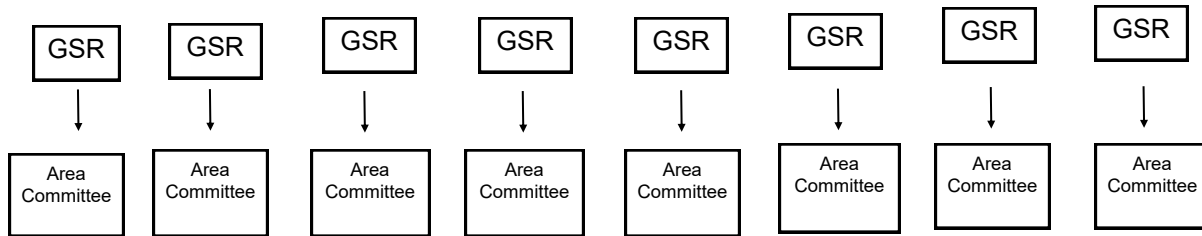

STRUCTURE OF THE FELLOWSHIP

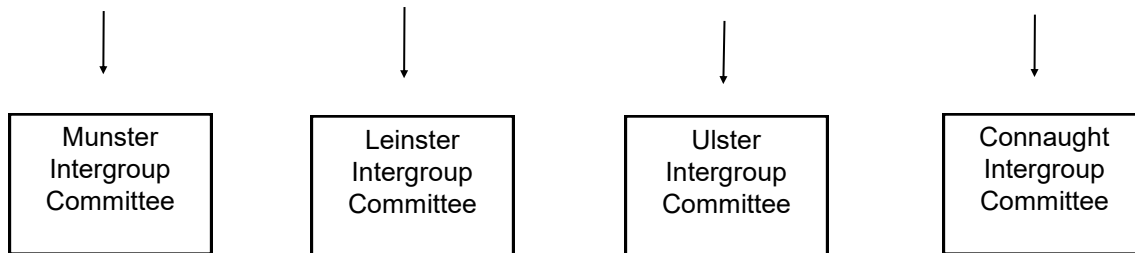
AA GROUPS (G)



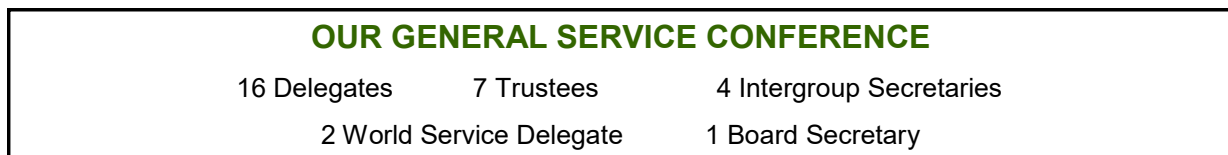
TWO GSR's FROM EACH GROUP FORM AREA COMMITTEE
